The Puppy Sponsorship Scheme

Cancer and Bio-detection Dogs always have a number of puppies. By sponsoring them you help support their care and training which enables them to change and save lives.

As a sponsor you will receive a certificate, photos and regular updates on all the puppies in training. During your sponsorship you will be invited to meet some of the dogs.

Puppies and dogs are donated to us from breeders and welfare charities and dogs are chosen according to their ability which allows us to use a variety of breeds. All dogs have the opportunity to become registered assistance dogs which means they are able to accompany their owner everywhere.

For those living with life threatening health condition having an assistance dog can make all the difference - a better quality of life, freedom, confidence and independence. They can also reduce the responsibility of care for carers and maybe enable people to return to work, college or just have a healthier active lifestyle.



Cancer Detection Dogs

The ability of dogs to detect human cancer cells using their sense of smell is being established and this project seeks to improve the dogs accuracy in detecting bladder, prostate, skin and other cancers.

Cancer and Bio-detection Dogs are working in partnership with university researchers to establish what it is that dogs can detect, scientists hope to use this information to develop an 'electronic nose'. This will enable routine screening schemes where cancer diagnosis can be made non-invasively, quickly and easily.

Being diagnosed with cancer is a very difficult experience but the earlier the diagnosis the better the chances of survival.

Diabetes Hypoglycaemia Alert Dogs

Hypoglycaemia (low blood sugar) is an acute daily problem for people living with diabetes. Hypos are frightening and distressing, symptoms can vary from confusion to seizures and can be life threatening.

Alert dogs are trained to recognise both high and low blood sugar levels. These levels give off a different scent compared with blood sugars that are within the normal range. Dogs with their incredible sense of smell have the ability to detect changes in glucose levels. When outside the normal range they alert their owners and can get help even before symptoms of hypo or hyperglycaemia (high blood sugar) are felt.

Medical Assistance Dogs

We also train Medical Assistance Dogs, for example, to detect and alert to potentially fatal conditions such as Addison's crisis.

In an emergency, anyone with Addison's disease can experience symptoms of extreme weakness, a serious drop in blood pressure and mental confusion. Without urgent medical treatment this can rapidly become life-threatening.
